# already/just/still/yet/never/ever

<b>Already</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Something that happened before now.</li><li>• Something that happened before it was expected.</li></ul> <p>IT IS NORMALLY IN AFFIRMATIVE SENTENCES</p>
<b>Just</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Something that happened very recently.</li></ul> <p>IT IS NORMALLY IN AFFIRMATIVE SENTENCES</p>
<b>Still</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Something has/has not happened up to this moment.</li></ul> <p>CAN BE USED WITH OTHER TENSES LIKE SIMPLE/CONTINUOUS ONES</p>
<b>Yet</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Something we expect(ed) to happen.</li></ul> <p>WE USE IT IN NEGATIVE AND INTERROGATIVE SENTENCES THIS EXPRESSION CLOSSES THE SENTENCE</p>
<b>Ever</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Evaluates if something has occurred previous to now.</li><li>• Denies that something has occurred previous to now.</li></ul> <p>IT IS USED IN NEGATIVE AND INTERROGATIVE SENTENCES</p>
<b>Never</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Denies that something has occurred previous to now.</li></ul> <p>IT GIVES A NEGATIVE VALUE TO A SENTENCE WHERE THE VERB IS AFFIRMATIVE</p>
