

WHAT IS AMBIGUITY?

AMBIGUITY DEFINITION

- Ambiguity is a statement or sentence which could have more than one possible interpretation, it is up to the listener or reader to determine what the true interpretation could be. There are some statements which may be ambiguous when said alone but with additional information, the ambiguity could be removed.
- When used as a literary device, ambiguity can give the reader the opportunity to think more deeply about the text that they are reading. A writer will often use ambiguity to give additional layers to their work as well as giving the reader some freedom by allowing them to make their own interpretation of what is happening.


